INSTRUCTIONS FOR POSTER PRESENTATIONS

Poster sessions:

Posters for themes 1 and 3 will be displayed on 13 April, and posters for themes 2, 4 and 5 will be displayed on 15 April.

During the poster sessions, authors must be present next to their posters.

Session 1 and 3 (13 april):

Poster set-up: Between 17:00 – 19:00 on Sunday 12 April and between 8:00 – 09:15 on Monday 13 April

Poster removal: From 18:00 on Monday 13 April

Session 2, 4 and 5 (15 april):

Poster set-up: From 18:00 on Monday 13 April and between 8:00 – 09:15 on Wednesday 15 April

Poster removal: From 18:00 on Wednesday 15 April

Poster Printing and Delivery Service – 31st EGF General Meeting

General information:

Location at the venue: General Meeting Tend (Évora university, Colégio Espírito Santo)

Poster number: A list with posters numbers will be made available in the poster session room(s).

Adhesive pads/tape: will be provided by the organisers

Poster preparation guidelines

- 1) The poster must contain the following elements:
 - a) author(s) and institution (positioned at the top); A photograph at the top right corner will help the audience to identify the presenting authors(s).
 - b) A poster is not a vehicle to present the details normally contained in a scientific paper. However, it can contain elements-like a brief introduction, methods, (provisional) results and (provisional) conclusions (or "Take-home message").
- 2) The language of the poster should be English.
- 3) Make sure that the message is clear and simple. Text should be kept to a minimum and presentations, e.g., graphs, histograms and photographs are strongly encouraged. Simplicity: Focus on one main concept; use bullet points, sentence fragments.
- 4) Appropriate use of color improves readability. Use high-contrast colors wisely; avoid too many colors.
- 5) Lettering: Guidelines for minimum font sizes (letter height) are as follows:
 - Poster title: 20mm
 - Author(s), institution: 13mm
 - Headings: 13mm
 - Body text: 9mmEnsure clarity for reading from 1,5-1,8 m away. The "A4 Test" can be useful: print a section on A4 and check readability at arm's length.
- 6) Poster Size & Format: A0 Portrait (84.1 cm wide x 118.9 cm high). All posters will be placed on panel boards in portrait orientation.
- 7) Logistics:
 - a) Presence: At least one author must be at the poster during the session.
 - b) Setup/Removal: Arrive early to set up and remove promptly after your session ends.
